

## *Notice of Proposed Amendment to Baker West Neighborhood Association Bylaws*

In accordance with the Bylaws, notice is hereby given by the Board of Directors that the following Bylaw amendment will be considered at the NEXT membership meeting having an Organization Quorum.

**Amendment #2008-002:** Annexing two houses on Bucknall Rd. into BWNA Boundaries.

**Proposal:** Annex the residential addresses of 5056 and 5070 Bucknall Rd., located near the corner of Villanova Rd., into Baker West Neighborhood Association's boundaries.

### ARTICLE 5 – BWNA BOUNDARIES

The Baker West area includes all homes and apartments that are on/within the following geographic boundaries:

- On the West – homes on the east side of Quito Road, from Bucknall Road to El Paseo de Saratoga property;
- On the North –the south property line of El Paseo de Saratoga
- On the South –houses **primarily** on the north side of Bucknall Road from Quito Road to the western edge of Baker Elementary School property, **but also including 5056 Bucknall Rd. and 5070 Bucknall Rd.;**
- On the East – the western edge of Baker Elementary School property from Bucknall Road to Campbell Avenue;
- On the Northeast – the two apartments at the corner of Campbell Avenue and Northlawn Drive.

(This area is defined in the Santa Clara County Assessor maps Book 403, Pages 01, **29**, 31, and 32.) For association with the merchants at El Paseo de Saratoga, BWNA also includes the El Paseo de Saratoga Shopping Center.)

### **Rationale for Change**

There currently isn't a neighborhood association covering the two houses. Bonnie Denoyer and Nada Zeid have relatives that live within the current boundaries. They have come to the last two general meetings and have signed up to be street leaders for Bucknall Rd. It would be an honor to include them as a member of our neighborhood association. If a neighborhood association eventually does form that includes these two homes, then they can have the option to remain with us or join the new association.

**Parliamentary information:** Primary and secondary amendments to these proposed bylaw amendments are in order only if they are *germane* to the proposed bylaw amendments and are *within the scope of the change proposed in the notice*. "Amendments" which do not seek to directly change the text of the proposed amendments within the limitations of germaneness and scope, but instead propose to amend other parts of the affected section amount to new bylaw amendments will be out of order. Notice of such new proposed bylaw amendments may be given when there are no other pending motions
